In this project a young person is someone aged between 15 and 20 years old.




This project wants to know what stops young people from making decisions.


Physical disability (wheelchair user, limited mobility or people whose arms or legs don't work in the same way as other people)



	The VOICES project looked at how the law treats people with disabilities from all over the world when they make decisions.


# What will people taking part have to do?







# Who will read or listen to what I send in?
